In January 2018, a forty-nine-year-old man named Roy Jones was working at the customer-engagement center of Marriott International Inc. in Omaha, Nebraska. One day while operating Marriott's Twitter account, he liked a Tibetan independence group's tweet that cited Marriott for listing Tibet as independent from China. Three days later, Jones was fired.

Most Americans don't realize just how much influence the Chinese Communist Party has in the United States, but the truth is China has been working under the radar to destroy the rights and systems crucial to American livelihood for decades. It's hurting everyone—especially those at the bottom—and if left unchecked, threatens fundamental freedoms that set America apart from undemocratic nations.

In this book, retired Air Force Brigadier General Robert Spalding reveals the damage China has already done. - signing a thirty-year agreement with the United States that allows China to share peaceful nuclear technology, ensuring that they have access to American nuclear know-how.

This book does not aim to just sound an alarm. It is meant as a call to arms—one that details how the United States and the rest of the free world can combat China's stealth war. Despite all the damage done so far, Spalding shows how it's still possible for the United States and the rest of the free world to stop China in its tracks and turn the tide.
